

Obituary for Roland Hubert

Lowell, MA- Roland H. Hubert, 91, died peacefully Friday October 28th at the Fairhaven Nursing Home in Lowell. He was the husband of the late Stasia C. (Fronc) Hubert who died on August 6, 1990.

Born in Lowell on July 21, 1920, Roland was the son of late Amedee and Bernadette (Proulx) Hubert. Roland served his country in the Army during WWII before being honorably discharged.
